Anti-Ragging Committee Inspection Report – AR 04

Introduction

In continuation of the institution's commitment to maintaining a safe, disciplined, and student-friendly environment, the Anti-Ragging Committee carried out regular monitoring and inspection activities during the month. The committee focused on preventing any form of ragging, harassment, or misconduct through consistent supervision and interaction with students in key areas such as the hostel, canteen, and campus premises.

This report presents the summary of activities undertaken, observations made, and feedback received during the month.

Hostel Monitoring

The committee conducted periodic visits to the hostel premises during different times of the day.

Observations

- Hostel rooms, corridors, study areas, and common spaces were inspected.
- Students were found following hostel rules and maintaining discipline.
- No disturbances or behavioural issues were noticed during the visits.

Interaction with Students

- Students were interacted with informally to understand their comfort and well-being.
- Students expressed satisfaction with the hostel environment.

Warden Feedback

Display of Guidelines

- Anti-ragging instructions, helpline numbers, and notices were clearly displayed and visible.

Campus Inspections

Committee members conducted rounds across the campus covering classrooms, laboratories, library, corridors, open areas, and playground.

Discipline and Behaviour

- Students maintained discipline in academic and non-academic areas.
- Classroom and laboratory activities were conducted smoothly.
- No incidents related to ragging or harassment were observed.

Faculty Interaction

- Faculty members reported no behavioural issues among students.
- Students were cooperative and actively engaged in academic activities.

Awareness and Preventive Measures

To ensure continued awareness, the following steps were taken:

- Regular reminders on anti-ragging rules through notice boards.
- Briefing students about grievance redressal mechanisms and helpline contacts.
- Faculty advisors were encouraged to guide students on maintaining discipline and mutual respect.
- Monitoring of common areas was strengthened during break hours.

Complaint box and helpline contacts were checked periodically.

Students confirmed that they had not faced or witnessed any ragging-related issues.
