Anti-Ragging Committee Inspection Report – AR 03

Introduction

The Anti-Ragging Committee conducted routine inspections and monitoring activities across the campus to ensure a safe, disciplined, and welcoming atmosphere for all students. Regular rounds were carried out in the hostel, canteen, and campus throughout the month. This report outlines the observations, interactions, and preventive measures taken during the period.

Hostel Visits

Committee members visited both boys' and girls' hostels multiple times during the month.

Student Interaction

- Students were approached individually and in small groups to understand their overall comfort and satisfaction with the hostel environment.
- Students reported that they are comfortable, and no issues of harassment or misconduct were observed.
- The interactions showed that students maintain a cooperative and friendly attitude.

Hostel Environment

- Common areas such as corridors, study rooms, dining halls, and entrance zones were inspected.
- Students were engaged in academic activities and daily routines without disturbances.
- No inappropriate behaviour or conflicts were reported.

Administrative Feedback

- Wardens confirmed that there were no complaints received during the month.
- All safety measures were found to be in place, and anti-ragging information was displayed properly.

Canteen Inspection

Regular monitoring was done during breakfast, lunch, and evening breaks.

Observations

- Students were seen interacting positively and maintaining discipline.
- No bullying, teasing, or any form of misconduct was noticed.
- The canteen environment remained calm and student-friendly.

Staff Feedback

- Canteen staff informed that they did not come across any problematic behaviour.
- They were briefed to report any suspicious activity immediately to the committee.

Awareness Materials

Anti-ragging posters, helpline numbers, and instructions were visible on the canteen notice board.

Campus Rounds

Committee members conducted rounds in classrooms, laboratories, library, playground, corridors, parking area, and other common zones.

Behaviour & Discipline

- Students were observed following all rules and maintaining discipline.

- No signs of harassment, conflict, or negative behaviour were identified.
- Academic areas were found functioning smoothly.

Faculty Feedback

- Faculty members did not report any issues related to student behaviour.
- Students were attentive, cooperative, and engaged in their academic activities.

Student Feedback

- Students expressed satisfaction regarding safety and discipline on campus.
- They were reminded of anti-ragging guidelines and support mechanisms.

Awareness Activities Conducted

- To reinforce the importance of a ragging-free atmosphere:
- Anti-ragging posters were displayed in classrooms, hostels, and common areas.
- Students were briefed about rules, helpline numbers, and grievance mechanisms.
- Information was circulated through class groups and notice boards.
- A short awareness talk was conducted during regular sessions.

Complaints & Grievances

- Nature of complaints: No issues reported
- Complaint box, helpline numbers, and email were regularly checked.
- Students confirmed that they have not experienced or witnessed any misconduct.

Conclusion

The campus atmosphere during the month remained safe, peaceful, and ragging-free. Students showed responsible behaviour across hostel, canteen, and campus areas. The Anti-Ragging Committee will continue regular monitoring, awareness programmes, and follow-up inspections to maintain this positive environment.
