Anti-Ragging Committee Inspection Report – AR 02

Objective of Inspection

The inspection was conducted to:

- Ensure continued compliance with AICTE/UGC anti-ragging regulations.

- Conduct visits to hostels, canteen, and campus areas for proactive vigilance.
- Reinforce awareness about anti-ragging policies and reporting mechanisms.

Inspection Schedule & Observations

During Class Breaks:

- Committee observed corridors, classrooms, and student assembly areas.
- Student behavior remained orderly; no instances of ragging observed.

During Lunch Break:

- Monitored the canteen and dining areas.
- All students interacted respectfully; no incidents of harassment reported.

During Free Periods:

- Checked library, laboratories, and open spaces.
- Student conduct was disciplined; no signs of intimidation or bullying.

Hostel Visits:

- Inspected rooms and common areas; all maintained safely and cleanly.
- No complaints of ragging reported.

Campus Monitoring:

- Walkways, parking areas, and recreational spaces inspected.
- Notices and display boards about anti-ragging visible and informative.
- Overall campus environment observed as safe and disciplined.

Student Awareness & Feedback

- Students confirmed knowledge of anti-ragging rules and reporting channels.
- Feedback suggested more interactive awareness programs and sessions for newcomers.
- Emphasized importance of vigilance during breaks and in hostel areas.

Suggestions / Action Points

- Continue regular inspections during breaks, free periods, and lunch.
- Conduct monthly awareness sessions for new and existing students.
- Encourage hostel wardens and faculty members to report any unusual incidents immediately.
- Display anti-ragging helpline numbers prominently in all student areas.
- Maintain inspection records to track compliance and improvement over time.

The Anti-Ragging Committee confirms that the campus remains ragging-free during this inspection period. Students follow rules and interact respectfully. Continuous monitoring, student awareness programs, and proactive engagement by faculty and wardens are recommended to sustain a safe and disciplined campus.
