Anti-Ragging Committee Inspection Report – AR 01

Objective of Inspection

The inspection was conducted to:

- Ensure compliance with AICTE/UGC anti-ragging guidelines.
- Maintain a safe and disciplined campus environment.
- Monitor student behavior during class breaks, lunch breaks, and free periods.
- Visit hostels, canteen, and campus areas to prevent any ragging incidents.
- Promote awareness about anti-ragging policies among students.

Inspection Schedule & Observations

During Class Breaks:

- Committee monitored corridors, classrooms, and assembly areas.
- Students observed moving in an orderly manner.
- No harassment or ragging incidents reported or observed.

During Lunch Break:

- Canteen staff and students cooperated with committee monitoring.
- No incidents of bullying, group pressure, or harassment occurred.
- Hygiene and safety measures maintained properly.

During Free Periods:

- Library, laboratories, and open areas inspected.
- Student interactions were respectful.
- No evidence of ragging or intimidation.

Hostel Visits:

- Rooms and common areas safe, clean, and well-maintained.
- No complaints of ragging; hostel wardens briefed students about anti-ragging rules.

Campus Monitoring:

- Open spaces, walkways, parking areas, and sports grounds inspected.
- Students observed following discipline.
- Display boards and notices regarding anti-ragging clearly visible.

Student Awareness & Feedback

- Students are aware of anti-ragging rules and helpline numbers.
- Suggested more frequent awareness sessions for new students.
- Requested visible anti-ragging information near hostel, canteen, and library.

Suggestions / Action Points

- Continue monitoring during breaks, free periods, and lunch.
- Conduct orientation sessions on anti-ragging policies for new students.
- Ensure hostel wardens and faculty actively monitor student interactions.
- Increase awareness about reporting channels for complaints.
- Maintain periodic inspections and record observations for future reference.

The Anti-Ragging Committee confirms that the campus is ragging-free during the inspection period. Students are aware of anti-ragging measures, and no incidents were reported or observed. Continuous monitoring, awareness programs, and proactive engagement with students are recommended to maintain a safe and disciplined environment.
